Local tourist information



Stadium Marketa can be found in the north-west part of Prague, just above the Brevnov Monastery, in a quiet residential area of Brevnov - Prague 6, about 20 minutes via public transport from the city centre.

How to get to the Marketa stadium:

By metro: The section of the metro line A makes Speedway fans' travels around Prague much easier. Marketa Stadium is located in the district of Petriny, therefore it is necessary to get off at a stop of the very same name. Most people would be heading towards the escalators but the speedway fans should aim for the elevators at the opposite side of the platform. Those would bring up the spectators to Brunclikova Street, which leads right to Marketa.

By bus: There is also a direct bus connection to the stadium, bus No. 191 from the Airport (approx 20mins). Nad Marketou bus stop is right next to the stadium.

By car: Motorway D5 (E50) from Plzen (Pilsen) Exit: <u>1/23 (E48)</u> to left Chomutov, Praha. Repy Airport, after 2kms (Exit 26) turn off to right Praha Repy Centrum straight ahead Centrum Brevnov, on 7th lights left.

Main touristic attractions near the stadium

Pražský hrad:

Prague Castle has been the seat of Czech princes and later kings since the 9th century, and since 1918 it has been the seat of the President of the Republic. Twice in history it became the main residence of the Holy Roman Emperor. According to the Guinness Book of Records, it is considered the largest ancient castle in the world - it covers an area of 570 m in length and 130 m in width. Part of the castle is a complex of historic buildings, which is dominated by the Cathedral of St. Víta, where the coronation jewels of Czech kings are stored. The entrance to Prague Castle is protected on all sides by a castle guard patrol.

Zoo Praha:

The Prague Zoo (officially the Prague Zoo) is a zoo in the lower part of Prague's Troja, opened on September 28, 1931. It is a contributory organization founded by the City of Prague. It is a zoo with modern pavilions and exhibitions, which tries to present the animals in conditions that are as close as possible to their natural environment, which allows for its rugged terrain. He is involved in the rescue of many endangered species and for some he maintains their worldwide studbooks. Převalský's horse breeding gained world fame; since 2011, the conservation project Return of Wild Horses has been implemented.
